

Along with our quality first teaching, this makes learning extremely effective in the classroom. Many of you will already know that we are a Dyslexia Friendly School. To gain this accolade, you have to be able to evidence that the school meets certain criteria in given areas. However, this has to be renewed through a reverification process every three years. It gives me great pleasure to announce that last week we had our reverification visit and have once again achieved Dyslexia Full Status. This is a brilliant achievement and helps to demonstrate our commitment to all learners. Well done to all and in particular the SEN team who led us through the process.

All the fantastic events organised by the PTFA raise money to provide our children with the 'extras' that the school budget cannot afford. At the beginning of July, we are having a 'Trim Trail' fitted for the children in the barked Forest Schools area.
