


Comparison of the UK to a Contrasting Non-European Country

COWWS for the UK:

- ❑ Climate - The UK has a temperate climate .
- ❑ Oceans and seas - The UK is an island and bordered by 4 seas: English Channel, the North Sea, the Irish Sea and the Atlantic Ocean.
- ❑ Weather - Britain has cool, wet winters and warm wet summers and the weather is easily changeable.
- ❑ Who and what animals and vegetation - Britain has a diverse population made up of many ethnicities. Britain's main wildlife is made up of deer, birds and sheep etc.
- ❑ See – The UK has many famous landmarks e.g. Big Ben, the Angel of the North, Stonehenge, Giants Causeway.

COWWS for India:

- ❑ Climate – India is home to an extraordinary variety of climatic regions, ranging from tropical in the south to temperate and alpine in the Himalayan north.
- ❑ Oceans – The Indian Ocean, the Arabian sea and the Bay of Bengal.
- ❑ Weather – In the North, they receive sustained winter snowfall. The nation's climate is strongly influenced by the Himalayas and the Thar Desert.
- ❑ Who and what - India is made up of 1.21 billion people who live in the country. Lions, elephants and tigers can be found throughout the country.
- ❑ See – Taj Mahal, Golden temple.


- ❑ The population of the Earth is 7 billion people.

Kenya

- ❑ Kenya Currency – Kenyan Shilling.
- ❑ Food – Ugali (cornmeal paste), Iriro (mashed peas and potato mix) Githeri (beans and corn).
- ❑ Transport – Paved and unpaved roads.
- ❑ Climate - The climate of Kenya varies by location, from mostly cool every day, to always warm/hot. The climate along the coast is tropical. This means rainfall and temperatures are higher throughout the year. At the coastal cities, Mombasa, Lamu and Malindi, the air changes from cool to hot, almost every day.

Australia

- ❑ Australian Currency – The Australian dollar.
- ❑ Food – Barbequed snag (sausages), Lamington (cake), Pavlova, barramundi (large scaled river fish).
- ❑ Transport – Train, bus, ferry and light rail (tram).
- ❑ Weather- Due to the huge size of the country, the northern section of Australia has a more tropical influenced climate: hot and humid in the summer, and quite warm and dry in the winter. Where as the southern parts are cooler with mild summers and cool, sometimes rainy winters.

Brazil

- ❑ Brazil currency - Brazilian Real.
- ❑ Food – Moqueca (fish stew), Brigadeiros (chocolate truffle), Pão de queijo (cheese and bread).
- ❑ Transport – Paved roads and with a limited rail network.
- ❑ Climate - In general, Brazil is a year-round destination with temperatures rarely below 20°C (68°F), apart from in the mountains and southern regions. The climate varies from hot and dry in the arid interior to humid and sticky in the tropical rainforests of the Amazon jungle.

USA

- ❑ USA currency – American dollars.
- ❑ Food – Apple pie, the hamburger, clam chowder, deep dish pizza and Texas barbeque.
- ❑ Transport – Car, truck, van, train, aeroplane.
- ❑ Climate - Being a huge country, the contiguous United States is home to a wide variety of climates. However, in general it has a continental climate, with cold winters (often frigid) and hot summers (sometimes very hot), with a different season duration depending on latitude and distance from the sea.

Antarctica

- ❑ Antarctica is a continent and a country.
- ❑ Currency – No official currency.
- ❑ Food – Seafood and shellfish.
- ❑ Transport – Aircraft and helicopters.
- ❑ Weather - Antarctica is the coldest continent on Earth. The average temperature in the interior throughout the year is about -57°C.
