I can mix primary colours to make some secondary colours.

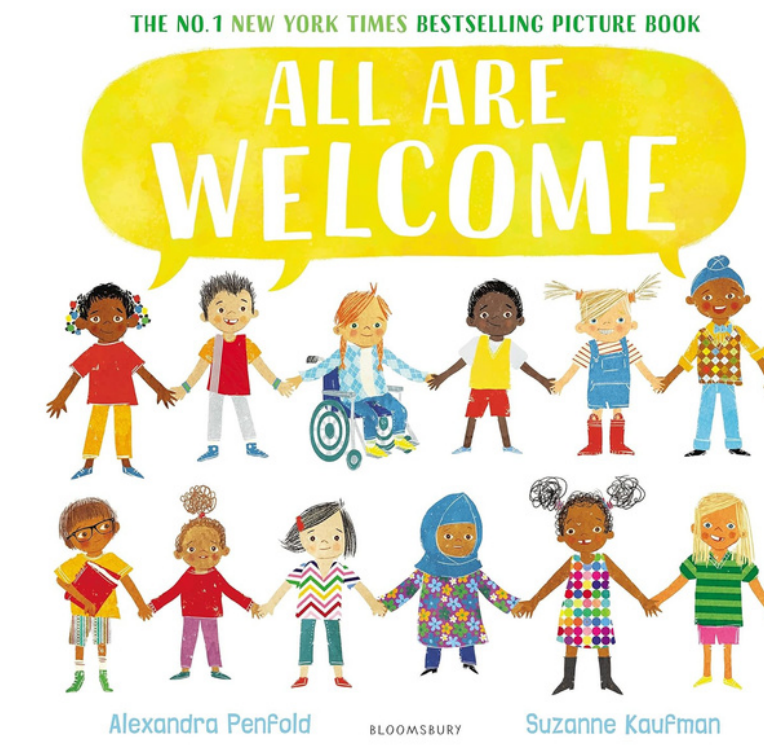
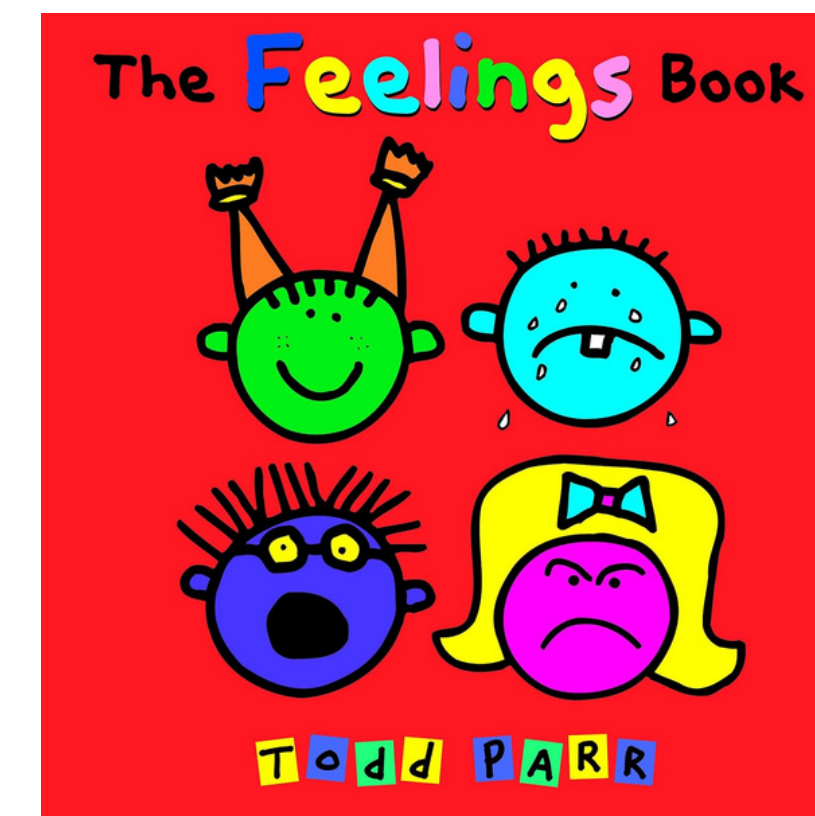
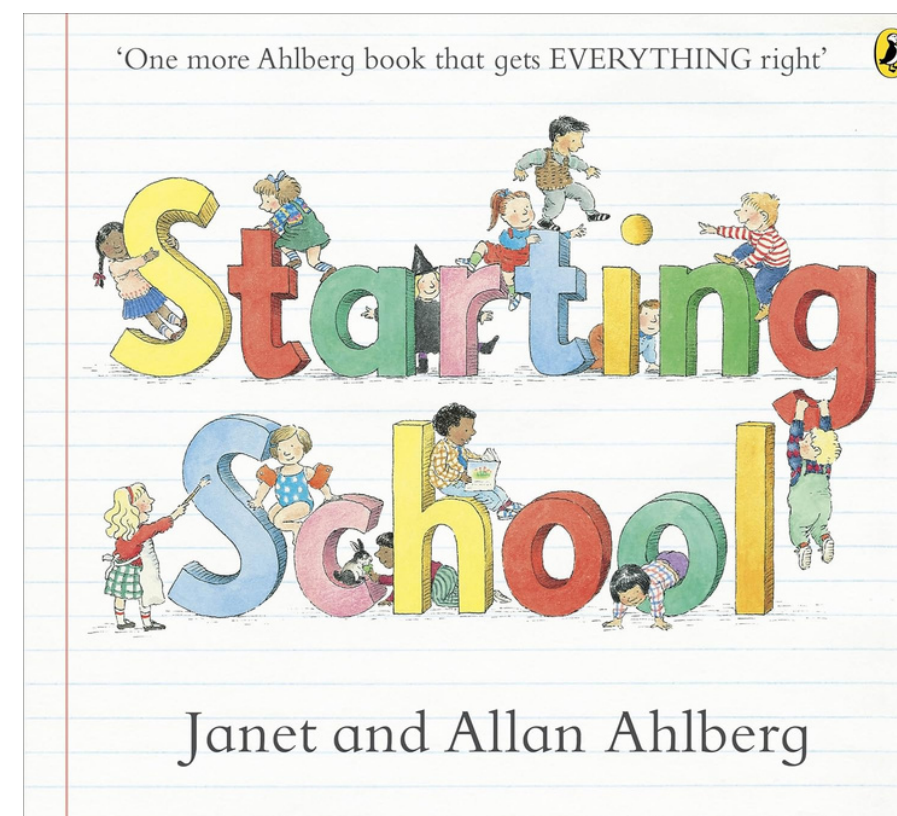
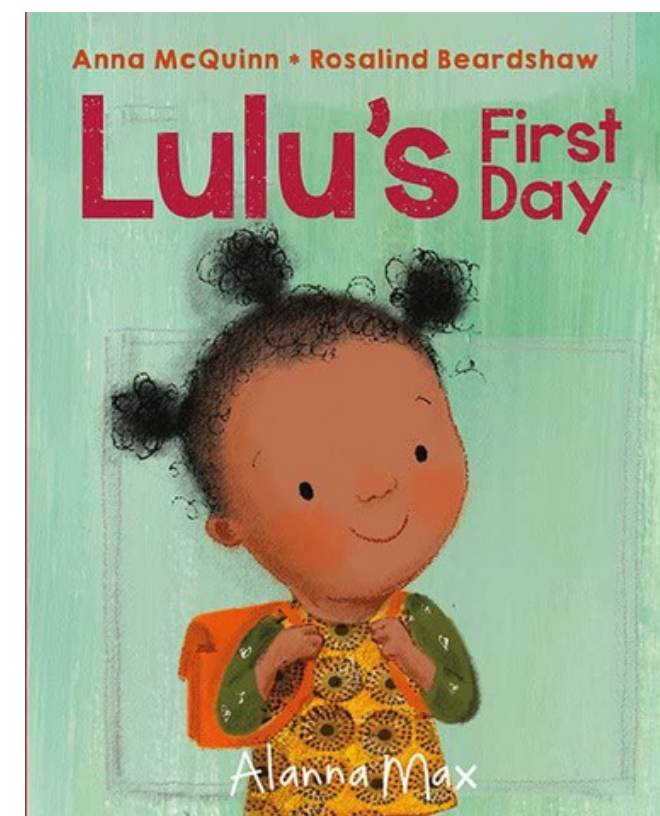
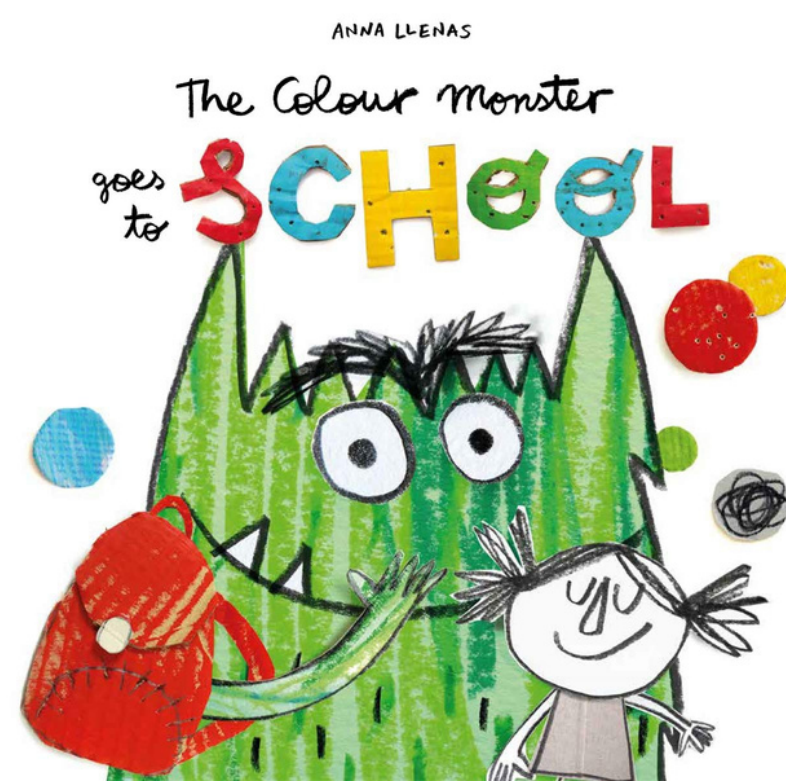
