Maths

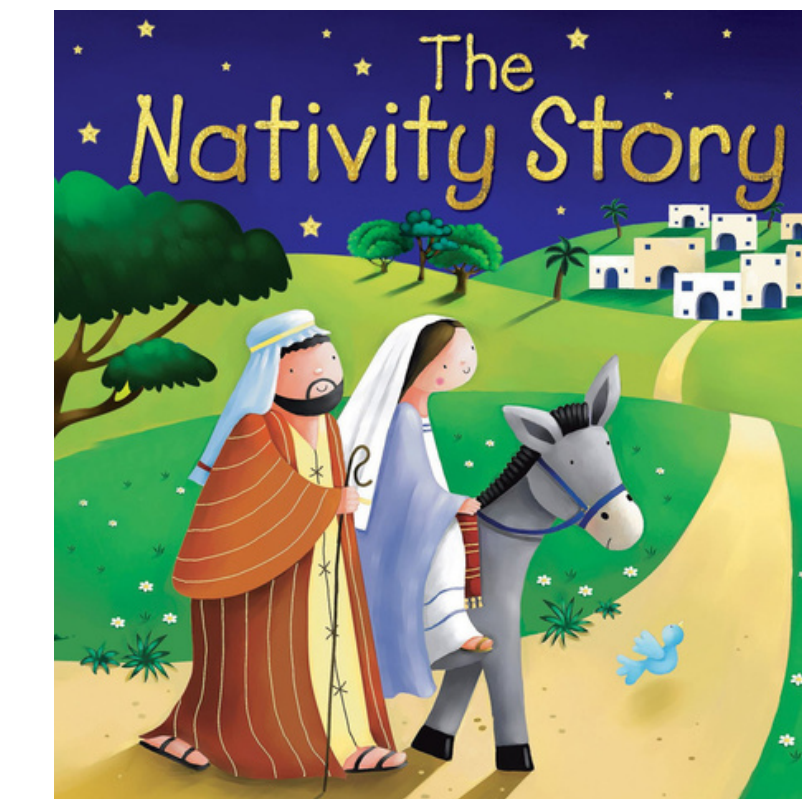
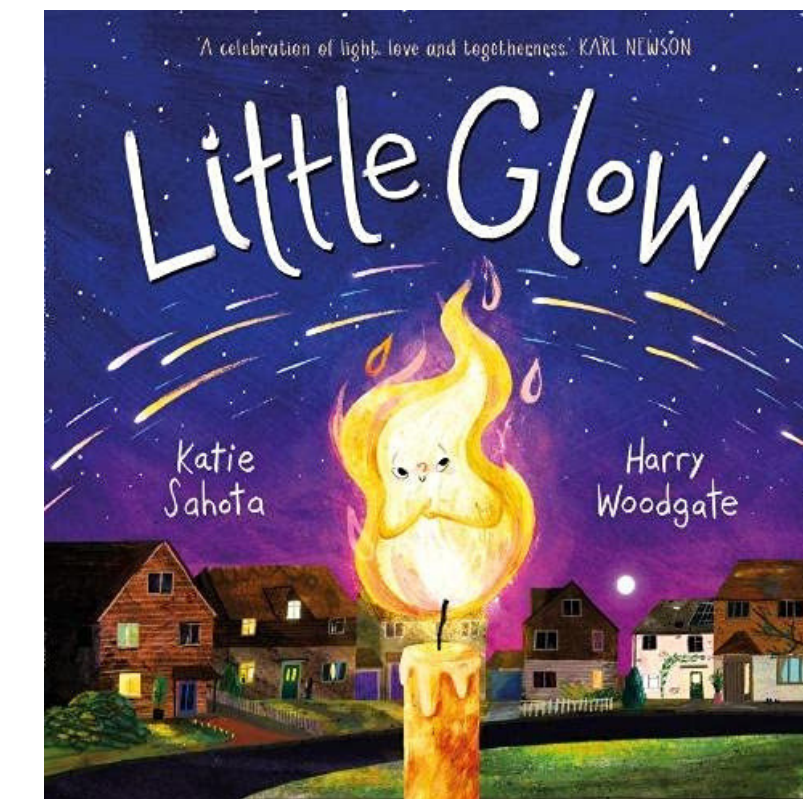
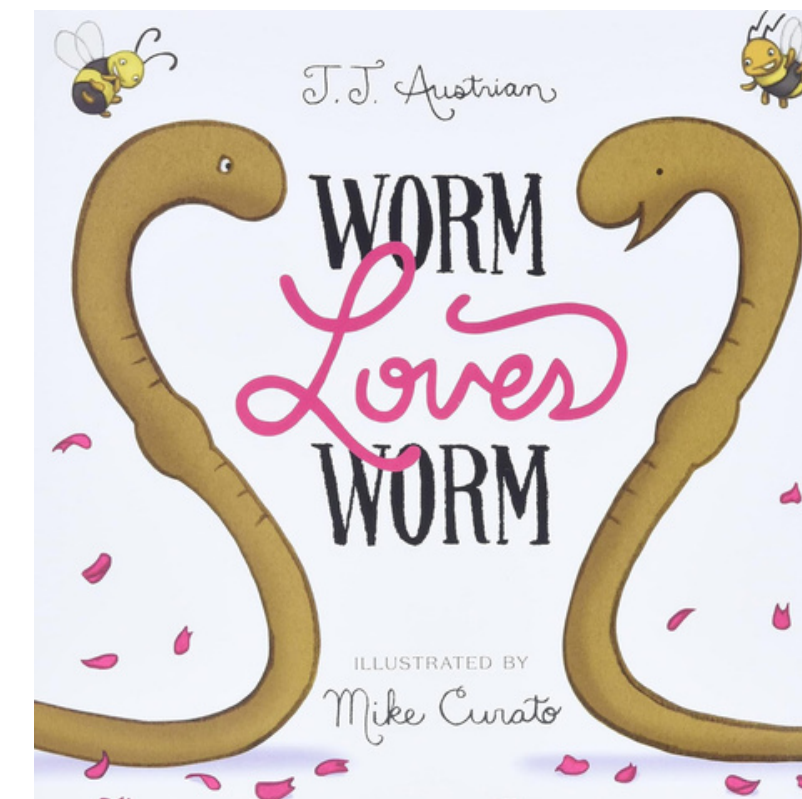
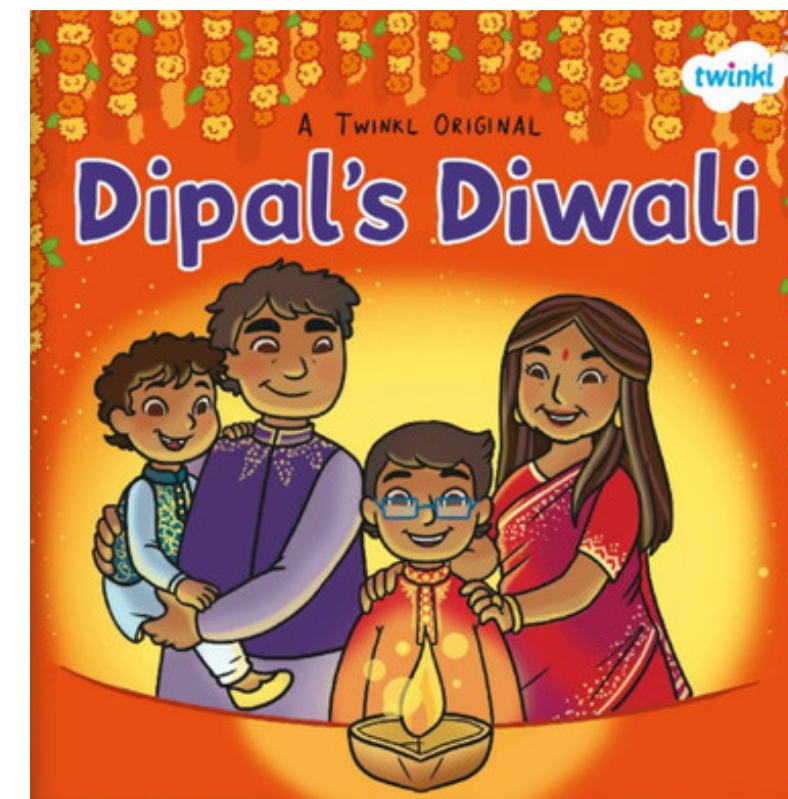
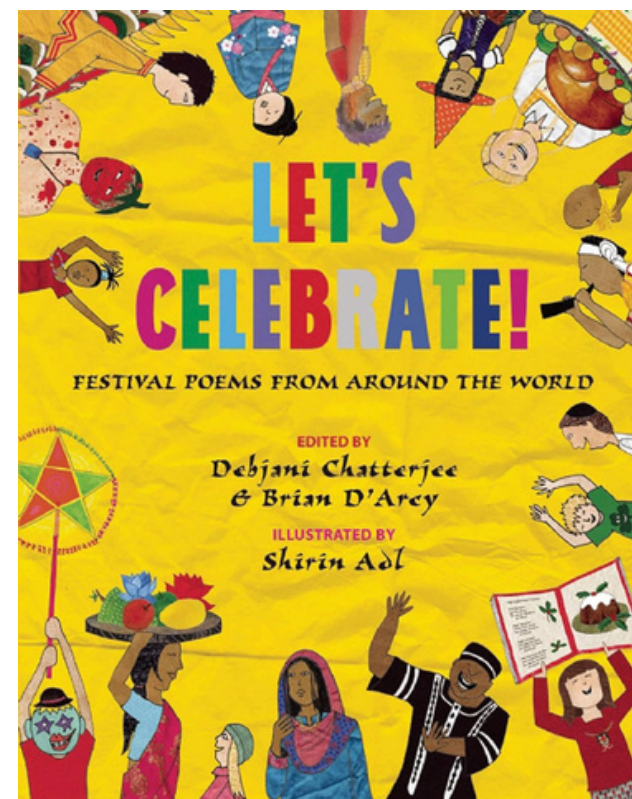
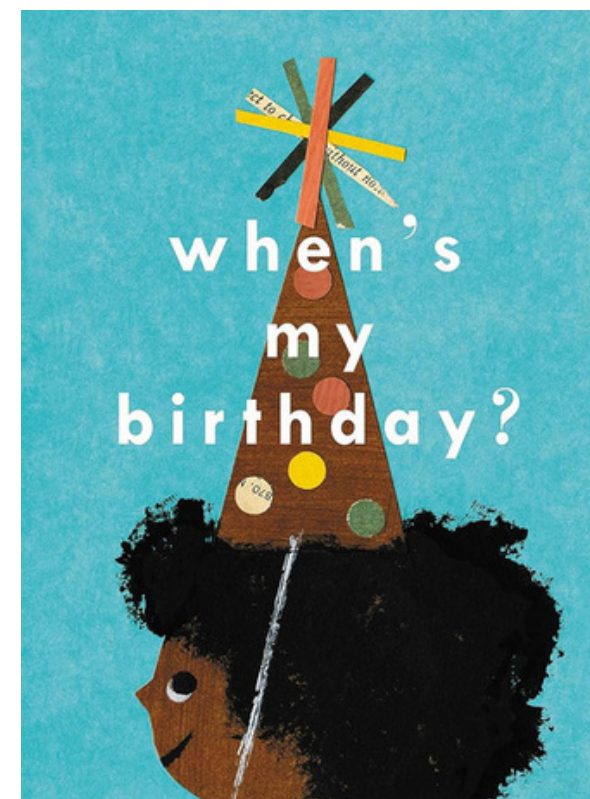
Exploring the composition of numbers to 5.
