I notice changes to the environment as seasons change and recognise some signs of winter (freezing).

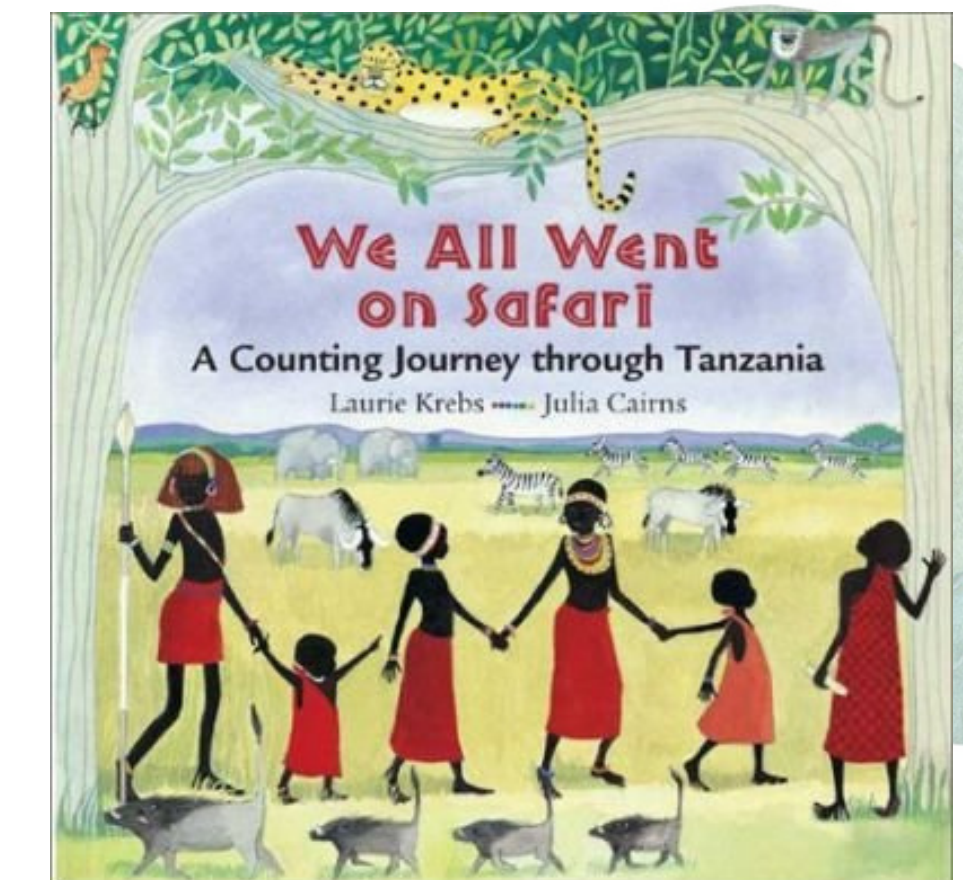
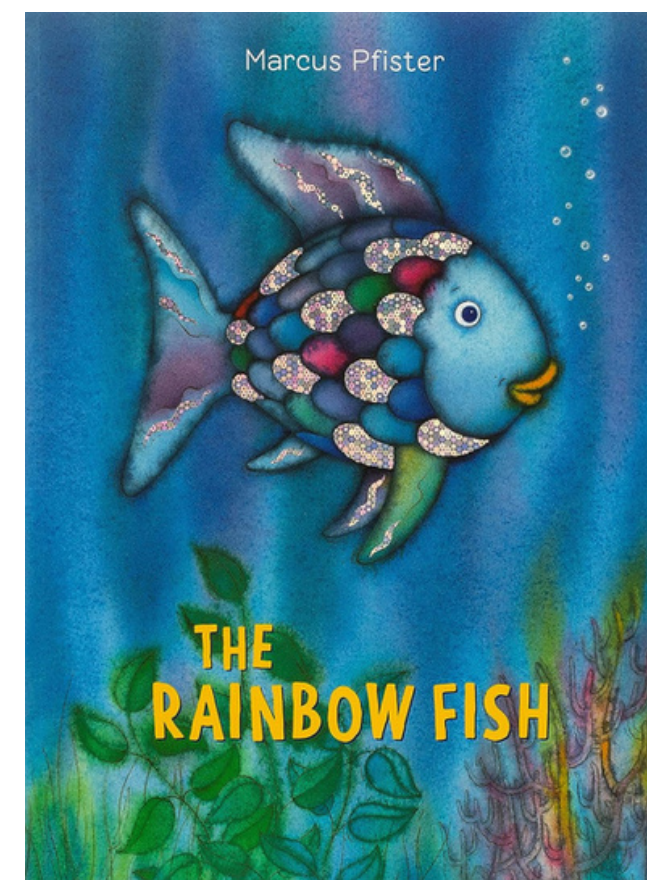
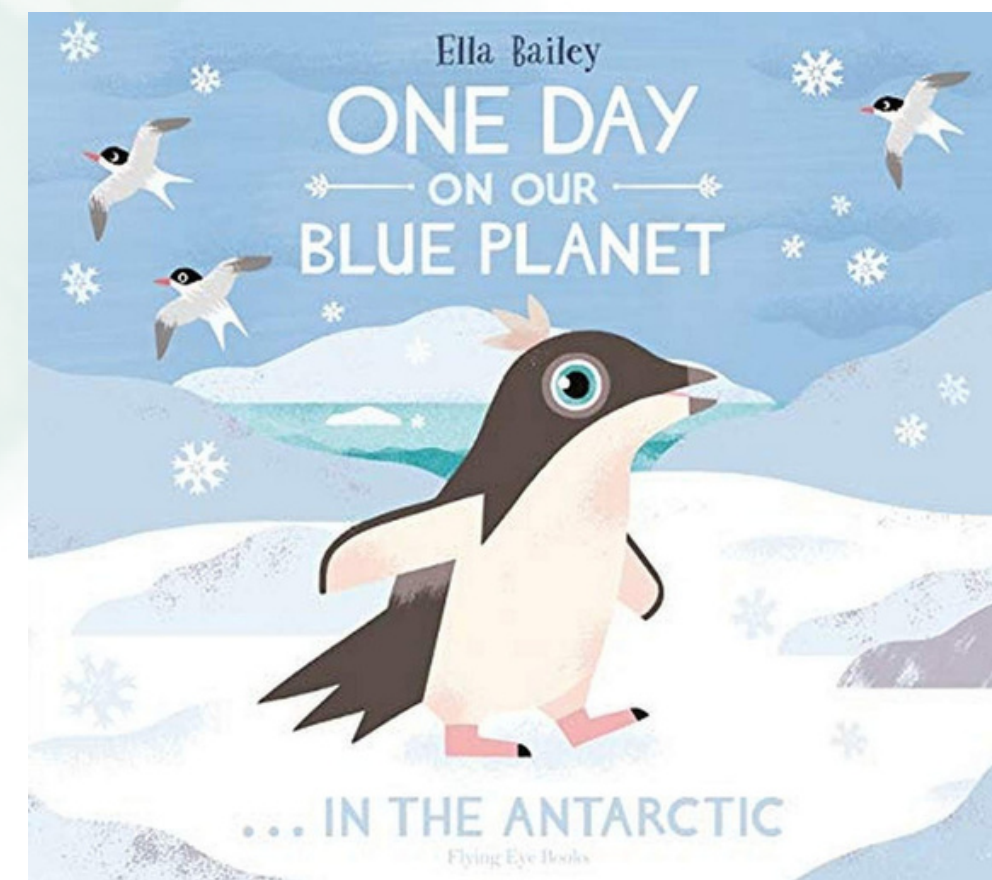
I can name a variety of animals and locate their habitats.
