



### Knowledge about Continents, United Kingdom and Five Oceans

- The 4 **countries** of the **United Kingdom** are **England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales.**
- The four **capital cities** of the United Kingdom are **London, Belfast, Edinburgh and Cardiff.**
- There are **borders** that separate different parts of the world and different countries.
- A **continent** is a land mass and an **ocean** is a large body of water.
- The **seven continents** of the world are **Oceania, Europe, Antarctica, South America, North America, Africa and Asia.**
- The majority (71%) of the world's surface is covered by water.
- The **five oceans** of the world are the **Atlantic, Pacific, Indian, Southern and Arctic.**
- The **climate** (the general weather over a long period) differs depending on the continent.
- The **equator** is the hottest part of the earth: this is due to the earth's orbit around the sun.
